- 1. Choice (A) is correct. (1:3,2:4) Sing is the verb form of singer, and compute is the verb form of computer.
- 2. Choice (B) is correct. (1:2,3:4) The trachea has air passing through it, and the endocrine system has hormones passing through it.
- 3. Choice (C) is correct. (1:3,2:4) A foul is undesirable in sports, and a stigma is undesirable in social settings.
- 4. Choice (D) is correct. (1:2,3:4) 6 squared + 8 squared = 10 squared. 7 squared + 24 squared = 25 squared.
- 5. Choice (C) is correct. (1:3,2:4) One finds news in a newspaper and synonyms in a thesaurus.
- 6. Choice (A) is correct. (1:2,3:4) Sparkling means "extremely clean," and jubilant means "extremely happy."
- 7. Choice (D) is correct. (1:2,3:4) Mathieu and Rousseau are French names; Alberto and Martinez are Spanish names.
- 8. Choice (B) is correct. (1:3,2:4) A protractor is a tool that a carpenter uses; a met-ronome is a tool that a musician uses.
- 9. Choice (A) is correct. (1:3,2:4) "Dropping like flies" and "hit the hay" are idioms.
- 10. Choice (C) is correct. (1:2,3:4) A board is a group of directors; a flight is a group of stairs.
